March 9, 2023

Commissioner Butrimas moved to approve the March 9, 2023 meeting minutes. Seconded by Commissioner Dellaquila

- 3. Consent Agenda
 - a. Request by Vincent Carbonell of the Spanish American Cultural Club for permission to consume alcoholic beverages (BYOB) for a summer picnic at Timberlin Park Pavilion on Saturday, June 10, 2023 from 10:00AM 6:00PM. There will be approximately 45 people in attendance ranging from ages 50 to 75. Food will be served buffet style. TULIP insurance will be obtained if alcohol permit is approved.
 - b. Request acceptance of a \$200 donation from Kiwanis Club of Berlin and a \$50 donation from Berlin VFW Post 10732 towards the Parks and Recreation Fishing Derbies that will be held on April 22 and April 29, 2023 at Sage Park Pond from 8:00AM 10:00AM.
 - c. Request by Saint Paul School to have field usage fees, not to exceed an amount of \$1,920 waived for the school soccer team practices at Percival Soccer Field for the spring 2023 season.
 - d. Request approval for Metro Swim Team to sell swimsuits, caps, goggles, bungee cords, etc. on June 22, 2023 at Percival Pool to participants on the Berlin Dolphin Swim Team, and to waive the vendor fee of \$200.

e. Request approval for Berlin Dolphins Swim Team Booster Club to sell prepackaged food and beverages at Berlin Dolphin Swim Team home meets in 2023.

Commissioner Butrimas moved to accept Consent agenda items a-e Seconded by Commissioner Dellaquila Those voting in favor: Chairwoman Donna Bovee, Commissioner Don Dellaquila, Commissioner Tony Butrimas, Commissioner Pulcini

Item c, Chairwoman Bovee noted about approvals and policy to potentially add their agenda item to the policy so they do not have to ask for exemption each year. Also Chairwoman Bovee noted that she attended the town's Easter Egg Hunt at the High School and she thought it was fabulous.

4. Parks and Recreation

a. Monthly Report, Jen Ochoa, Director Community, Recreation and Park Services reported the Easter egg hunt went well, it was moved due to the weather. There is still not enough staff to open Hubbard pool this summer so the Town Council was notified and they accepted the decision.

5. Parks & Grounds

The capital budget, there is 175k for the Willard Playground submitted and around 200k for Little Peoples. Both playgrounds need to be updated. Steve Wood, Superintendent of Parks and Grounds reported they had their final meeting to decide on the vendor for the Willard playground. They will have to decide which playground they will put money towards first. Part of their decision will prioritize the playgrounds that are open all day. He wants to have more of a partnership with the Board of Education in regards to the school playgrounds.

There was vandalism at Sage Park, and Comissioner Butrimas wanted to know if Police could start checking on Sage Park at night to deter this. Steve Wood, Superintendent of Parks and Grounds believes it occurred after hours at Sage Park and someone almost started a brush fire because they lit a garbage can on fire.

The commission needs to come up with a plan on how they want to combat the issue of garbage at the High School Basketball Courts. He had received an email from the custodian about bottles being smashed in the parking lot. It took three hours for his staff to clean up. A resident in the area had picked up all of the trash in the parking lot this past week. There have been many phone calls to the Police Department about this issue. Chairwoman Bovee suggested having the Police Chief attending a meeting just to discuss the issue.

In regard to the Dog Park, written warnings started in April, written tickets will start May 1st. The Town Council is in support of it. They tried to include in the budget to move the part-time animal control officer to full-time but it was cut from the budget.

There will be eight cameras installed at Scalise Field. The ice machine has been moved into the kitchen so it is locked. New keys will be created to enter the Youth Room. There will be cameras inside the Youth Room and outside the perimeter of the building. We do not have the wifi connectivity that we originally thought we had. The reason for the cameras is to stop the vandalism and issues taking place.

- 2. Working on entering new staff and have emailed all staff about blood borne pathogens program through CIRMA. Also sent out Mandated Reporter training to the Summer Fun staff and WSI. Coordinating first aid/CPR training for Summer Fun staff.
- 3. Will begin opening and closing p.o.'s for the end of the fiscal year.
- 4. Fishing derbies were held, nice turn out the first date and decent turn-out the second date considering weather conditions, over 100 total kids registered.
- 5. **New this year**, we are offering Parks and Recreation Team Tennis, with 6 matches against other Towns. We started to register for household, senior and individual swim passes and will begin registration for swim lessons, on May 22. Registration for all other programs has begun.

- 7. Started ordering supplies for Summer Fun program and Aquatics.
- 8. Started working on updating staff manuals for Aquatics and Summer Fun program.
