As of today, there are thirty Berlin residents that have been tested positive for the COVID-19 virus, ten of them are / were hospitalized and tragically one resident of our community passed away. Please join me in extending our deepest condolences to the family members of the resident who passed away and keeping all others who are in recovery in your prayers.

The Town Hall staff is committed to providing all of the services to our community even though the Town buildings are closed to the general public. In the spirit of the, "stay home stay safe", request from Governor Lamont, the Town staff are on rotating schedules and / or working from home when possible to create enough social distancing. I am pleased to share with you that during this unprecedented time, recognizing the financial difficulty many residents and businesses are facing in the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Town's elected officials came together with Town and Board of Education staff to deliver a 0 mill rate increase budget for fiscal year 2021. The budget continues existing services, maintains the Town's investment in infrastructure and recognizes the importance of investing in our schools.
