# THE ACTUAL USE AS A BASEMENT DWELLING (October 13, 1954 to date)

The original foundation, built by Dorothea and Richard Pautzsch, was configured with a door cut out into a contemplated basement garage, and then the garage was built by them in 1958, which has exclusively served the basement dwelling since that time. The vintage 1950's kitchen cabinets in the basement were custom built by the original owner, Richard Pautzsch, a cabinet maker by trade. The property was sold to the Cyrs on November 30, 1960.

Between November 30, 1960 and June 19, 1981 (almost 21 years), Raymond E. Cyr and Bernadette Cyr were the owners of 1005 Kensington Road, Berlin, CT. Their son, Kevin Cyr, resided at the house continuously during that time period and states that "the basement was used as a second family dwelling". Mr. Cyr notes that there was a fire on the <u>first</u> floor, causing the house to be vacated temporarily by the Cyr family. Upon their return, the basement continued to be used as a second family dwelling. The basement was <u>actually used</u> as a second family dwelling, including a "separate garage bay with a door into the basement dwelling, which was used exclusively by the occupants making their home in the basement."

The 2020 Census reflects the lengthy time that 1005 Kensington Road has been used as a 2-family dwelling.

#### Statement of Facts

### Actual Use of Basement at 1005 Kensington Road, Berlin Connecticut

- 1. I am Kevin Cyr son of Raymond E. Cyr and Bernadette Cyr.
- 2. On or about November 30, 1960, my parents, Raymond E. Cyr and Bernadette Cyr, became owners of 1005 Kensington Road, Berlin, Connecticut.
- 3. I lived at that property from on or about November 30, 1960 until on or about June 19, 1981.
- 4. During the entire time I lived at the property, the basement was used as a second family dwelling.
- 5. Sometime in 1969 or 1970 there was a fire on the first floor of the house. My family and I temporarily moved out of the house, but upon our return, the basement continued to be used as a second family dwelling until my family moved out, on or about June 19, 1981.
- 6. I make this affidavit for the purpose of confirming that the basement was actually used as a second family dwelling for the entire time my parents and I lived there. The use of the basement as a second dwelling was not abandoned.
- 7. There was a separate garage bay with a door into the basement dwelling which was used exclusively by the occupants making their home in the basement.

## **Affidavit**

- 1. When the house was originally constructed in the 1950's it was built so that the basement would be a used as a second family dwelling.
- 2. The kitchen cabinets presently in the basement were custom built by Richard Pautzsch, the original owner who was a cabinetmaker (see attached death certificate), to be used as a second family dwelling.
- 3. The original foundation was cut out to include a doorway dedicated to the basement garage, which garage entrance exclusively served and was used by the occupant of the basement dwelling as a garage entrance (see attached pictures).
- 4. The door from the first floor to the stairwell down to the basement is the principal door and contains a lock in order to separate the two dwellings.
- 5. As set forth in the affidavit signed by Kevin Cyr, the basement was actually rented as a second family dwelling.
- 6. The basement was actually used as a second family dwelling from 1960 to the present.

# Proposed Findings of Fact

- 1. The basement at 1005 Kensington Road, Berlin, CT was originally designed and constructed to be used as a second dwelling.
- 2. As originally built, the original concrete slab and foundation included a door opening formed through the foundation into a garage to be used exclusively by the basement dwellers and then the door and garage bay were actually exclusively and continuously used by the basement residents.
- 3. The existing basement plumbing is the original piping built into the original slab designed to serve and then actually serving the bathroom shower stall, toilet and kitchen located in the basement dwelling.
- 4. The 1950's vintage cabinets were custom built by the original owner of the basement dwelling, who was a cabinet maker.
- 5. From November 30, 1960 until June 19, 1981, the basement was actually and continuously used as a second family dwelling by the Cyr family.
- 6. From November 30, 1960 to the present, the basement was actually and continuously used as a second-family dwelling.
- 7. The US Census Bureau in its Census 2020 recognizes the house as a two-family dwelling.
