Chairwoman Bovee called the meeting to order at 6:02 p.m.

### 1. Audience of Citizens

### 2. Approval of Minutes

August 13, 2020 September 10, 2020

Commissioner Dellaquila moved to approve the August 13, 2020 meeting minutes.

Seconded by Commissioner Legnani.

Vote being 5-0. (MOTION CARRIED) Commissioners Hinchliffe and Legnani abstained, as they were not at the meeting.

Commissioner Butrimas moved to approve the September 10, 2020 meeting minutes.

Seconded by Commissioner Legnani.

Vote being 5-0. (MOTION CARRIED) Commissioners Bovee and Pulcini abstained, as they were not at the meeting.

### 3. Consent Agenda

- a. Request approval to add h to SECTION II, A of the Field/Facility Usage Policy. H would read, Sage 1 Softball Field is only to be used by Local (75% Berlin residents) Non-Profit Groups for softball with exceptions approved by the Berlin Parks and Recreation Department.
- b. Request acceptance of a donation from the Noyes Family of a \$20 gift certificate to Central Pizza to be used as the prize for the Berlin Parks and Recreation Department's 16<sup>th</sup> Annual Scarecrow Contest.

Commissioner Legnani moved to approve Consent Agenda item a as presented.

Seconded by Commissioner Dellaquila.

Director Ochoa noted that the proposed restriction to newly renovated Sage 1 softball field is similar to the restriction placed on Zipadelli Field to preserve its condition after expensive renovations.

Vote being 7-0. (MOTION CARRIED)

Commissioner Dellaquila moved to approve Consent Agenda item b as presented.

Seconded by Commissioner Legnani.

Vote being 7-0. (MOTION CARRIED)

### 4. Parks & Grounds

- a. **Monthly Report** see attached. Superintendent Wood added that all light bases at Scalise Field will be surveyed for damage. Portable LED towers are in place for the interim and working well. He also noted that the trash situation at BHS basketball / tennis courts has improved. Trash receptacles have been very full with much less litter on the ground.
- b. Sage 1 Update The project is moving along. Irrigation is in, fencing should be complete in a week or so. Soil analysis is being performed and once an acceptable ratio of organic matter in the soil is detected, sod will be laid down.
- c. **Pickleball Update** One tennis court at Hubbard will remain in its current layout, while the other court will have two pickleball courts painted onto it. Recent rain has kept the courts from being painted to date, but the painting should be finished by October 16, 2020.

Chairwoman Bovee noted that she would like to approach the groups that utilize Berlin's various fields about the Town's constantly increasing costs to care for the existing fields, as well as to fund construction of new fields (including the multi-use field that many sports have been asking for) and invite any financial assistance the groups are able to offer.

d. Volleyball at Sage Park – Director Ochoa reported that resident complaints were received about volleyball being played in Sage 2 field causing damage. Superintendent Wood stated that several areas of recently seeded / sprouted grass were damaged by the volleyball play. Commissioner Patel stated that he was part of the group that played volleyball. The Commission indicated that permits and certificates of insurance are required for any group utilizing the Town's fields. Also, field use applications must be filed (along with the appropriate permit and insurance) with the Parks & Recreation office and then considered by the Commission. Grounds will try to identify a level area for volleyball use long-term, subject to Commission approval (as with any other proposed use).

### 5. Parks and Recreation

- a. Monthly Report see attached. Superintendent Dennis noted that the Superintendent has delayed making a decision on whether or not to allow use of the indoor gyms for winter basketball. Any further delay will effectively eliminate the possibility of offering basketball this winter. Superintendent Dennis will investigate the possibility of offering outdoor winter activities. She stated that P&R programs are generally self-sustaining, so paid staff would have to be hired and registration fees would have to be charged to participants in order to cover costs.
- b. Community/Senior Center Update The consultant presented to the Commission on Aging, whose members had many questions and concerns. Commission on Aging Chairwoman Gombotz is compiling a list of questions which will be addressed at a future meeting. After that time, focus groups of less than 20 participants will be organized as community outreach.
- c. Fee Schedule Discussion The Commission and staff discussed proposed increases to fees based on the increasing minimum wage, as well as Berlin's history of charging significantly less than neighboring communities. An increase to lighting charges was also discussed, as the cost to operate lights at fields is exponentially higher than the fees charged to users. Chairwoman Bovee asked for a breakdown of the Town's costs to maintain fields and provide lighting vs. the fees imposed onto users. The Commission recognized that users are generally unhappy with increases, and it would be helpful to have the cost basis to explain why increases are necessary and why even increased fees do not begin to cover the Town's / taxpayers' costs. The Commission will consider the matters and vote in the November meeting.

### 6. Adjournment

Commissioner Hinchliffe moved to adjourn at 7:28 pm.

- 1. Fall programs have started. We are offering yoga and Painting w/Peggy, in person.
- 2. I contacted the Superintendent's office about school use this winter and was told that he is still not allowing outside groups in the building at this time and to check back the end of the month. This will immediately impact youth basketball.
- 3. Scarecrow Contest this year will be a little different than the past. We are encouraging people to put scarecrows in front of their house and also for businesses to set up in front of their business or at Volunteer Park. Participants can send in a picture and people can vote on Facebook for the Berlin Best Scarecrow, starting October 21 through October 30. We will also do the Pumpkin Decorating contest on-line. Participants can send in a picture of their pumpkin and we will post of Facebook for people to vote for their favorite so we can continue with our "People's Choice" contest. 

departments of the Town may institute more restrictive refund policies provided those policies are communicated to users at the time of purchase.

Per Sec. 3-31(b) of the Town Charter, "an owner reclaiming an impounded animal shall pay a fee, as determined by the town council and listed in the town fee schedule, for impoundment, plus any advertising costs, plus board for each day the animal is impounded, plus veterinary costs incurred by the town." The Berlin Animal Control Officer shall have the authority to waive the fees listed in Sec. 3-31(b) of the Town Charter with approval of the Town Manager.



### Parks and Recreation monthly report for November

- 1. Winter basketball and other winter programs held in the schools continue to be on hold as the Superintendent's office is not comfortable making a decision on outside groups using the schools, due to recent increases in COVID-19 numbers. I will contact his office weekly for updates to see if we are able to move forward with any of the programs.
- 2. Scarecrow Festival was held virtually this year with 24 scarecrows entered. Voting took place on-line and there was a tie for Berlin's Best. Both winners received a gift card.
  - Our first Drive-thru Trunk or Treat event was held on Friday, October 23 at Sage Park. We had 165 kids registered. We had 15 trunks decorated and all 4 volunteer Fire Departments were represented. It was a great night and people were very happy and appreciative.
  - We had eleven pumpkins register for the Pumpkin Decorating contest. We posted all Pumpkins on Facebook and the pumpkin with the most likes, was named the People's Choice. The winner will have their name engraved on the plaque in the Parks and Recreation office. All participants were sent a \$5 gift card to Pralines.
- 3. I have been in contact with my colleague at the YMCA and we have decided to make the Tinsel Fun Run a virtual run this year. We are working with the timing company to get information out to hold the event. It was a difficult decision but we feel it is the best decision at this time.
- 4. We continue to have groups meet at the Community Center, even with the new COVID guidelines in place. Things have been going well so far. We had a blood drive in October and the Red Cross has reached out to offer another one in January. We have been able to hold dance and painting classes in person. I was notified by Personal Euphoria, the company that we work with for our current yoga classes, that they are going totally virtual for the winter. We will be offering three classes this winter Barre, Tighten & Tone and Core Strength.
- 5. We have decided due to COVID-19 that we will not be having our annual Santa's Parlor this year.
- 6. I have completed my recommendations for next year's budget. I am again asking for a parttime Recreation Supervisor position and have included new pay rates, based on scheduled minimum wage increases.
