Chairwoman Donna Bovee called the meeting to order at 6:01 p.m.

#### 1. Audience of Citizens

- a. George Satalino, 33 Griswold Drive- Mr. Satalino represents Berlin Little League requesting permittance for the Fall 2022 and Spring 2023 season to hang vinyl 4x6 signs with sponsors logos on the fencing of Centurelli Field, Dennehey Field, Petit Field Complex and Baretta Field. These will be hung with zip ties and they have gotten rid of all wood signs. Questions about removal of championship signs and Mr. Satalino assured they are staying as is.
- b. Carlo Ruscito, 41 Garden Drive- Mr. Ruscito is requesting approval to consume alcoholic beverages for a family picnic at Timberlain. The picnic ranges from 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. and expects 35-40 people in attendance. It is noted that Mr. Ruscito is returning from previous years to request approval again. Mr. Ruscito is aware he has to purchase Tulip Insurance for his event on July 23rd.
- c. Scott Trevethan, 230 Circlewood Drive and Jim Mazarella, 362 Lower Lane- Mr. Trevethan and Mr. Mazarella are requesting approval and advocating for the need of pickleball courts in Berlin. Mr. Trevethan noted Berlin is the "only town in Central Connecticut without public pickleball courts" and referenced New Britain, Middlefield, and West Hartford. Mr. Trevethan and Mr. Mazarella expressed they have high numbers of towns members interested in playing pickleball, especially from a beginner level and propose changing the East Berlin tennis courts into pickleball courts. Mr. Trevethan stated that the Tyler Cop and Ryan Lee Foundations have offered supplemental funding and he is requesting the town to partner with him on the initiative. Questions were raised by commissioners about registration processes, reserving courts, and how many courts they wish to

create. Mr. Mozzarella stated he can construct a diagram with exact measurements to create the 6 to 8 courts proposed. Chairwoman Bovee emphasized there is a process to getting town funding. And it was proposed by Mr. Mazarella for the Grounds Department to at least paint lines on the courts in the interim. The proposed cost of this project would be from 250k to 60k. Commissioners supported the endeavor and will advocate within the town committee.

There will be about 40 guests with ages ranging from 10 to 80 years old. Food will be served buffet style with no entertainment. TULIP insurance will be obtained if alcohol permit is granted.

#### 5. Parks and Recreation

- a. Monthly Report, Superintendent Dennis stated all staff has a zoom training for epi pen administration, Superintendent Dennis states that the report is accurate on her end and there is still a position open in their office looking for a secretary. Commissioner Bovee asked for clarification on the lifeguard report. Superintendent Denns stated that the town will most likely only have Percival Pool open on weekends due to a limited number of supervisors. It was stated that the number of attendees supports only one pool being open on weekends and that hours might have to be flexed due to only having 5 supervisors. Shout outs were given to Superintendent Dennis for her great work. The schools are allowing movies to occur outside their building this summer and BOE is being helpful in the process. Commissioner Dellaquila asked about bringing live music to the town and Superintendent Dennis said the activity didn't bring town support as well as had high cost. It was noted East Berlin pool passed inspection earlier in the day.
- b. Community Center Update, Commissioner Bovee stated the town's community center forums are accessible on youtube. Commissioner Bovee reports that there were a decent number of senior citizens asking questions at the forum and speaking out about the tax impacts. Commissioner Bovee stated that the Y, as proposed as an alternative, should do a feasibility study. Commissioner Starr said that the Y doesn't meet the town's needs assessment and that getting grant money is a challenge in itself. Commissioner Bovee shouted out Director Ochoa for serving as a liaison to the advisory committee.

#### 6. Parks and Grounds

- a. Monthly Report, Superintendent Wood discussed the possibility of pickleball courts and that when he investigated it there was a quote made for around 200k. The East Berlin pool, in and of itself is 200k to fix and urges Commissioners to realize the East Berlin pool investment isn't worth it. Commissioner Dellaquila mentioned that most towns only have one pool and typically invest in that one. Commissioners held the opinion that the money should be invested elsewhere, i.e. maybe a pickleball court like proposed. Commissioner Bovee proposed utilizing a financial fact sheet with an assessment of the pool to support reallocation of funds. Next steps are for Superintendent Wood to get an assessment of the area and then look at needs on the capital list with a timeline of September meeting. Superintendent Wood stated the bridge at Ragged Mountain is on their main list to fix because it is a safety issue and that they have received many compliments on the Gold Star Memorial and flower beds around town.
- b. Dog Park Update, Superintendent Wood discussed two areas of park options, there is a meeting next Thursday at Pistol Creek to walk through areas. The park would be enclosed on 3 sides with fencing and one natural fencing buffer. There would be two main gates for access and would cost about 16k. They are using areas in Southington, Rocky Hill, etc. for reference. There will not be separate sides for small dogs and big dogs.

- c. Percival Soccer Field Update, Superintendent Wood stated they are doing an analysis of the field and have realized there is no topsoil at all on the field, so they will be experimenting with it and have a meeting next Wednesday about the soil analysis.
- d. State of CT Grant Update, Director Ochoa said they have been reviewing bids for an architect for Biscoglio field and they range from 59 to 84k, they are seeing what bids meet the qualifications. Commissioner Starr asked for a timeline for this and Director Ochoa assured they are on target for both projects at this time.

Director Ochoa requested to cancel the July meeting, All in favor







# Parks and Recreation monthly report for July/August

- 1. Percival Pool is scheduled to close on Saturday, August 13. Demore, Dinda Bittner Jr. Memorial Pool closed August 5.
- 2. We offered four sessions of swim lessons and were able to offer 8 more classes than last year. Each session was one week and the classes were 40 minutes long. We filled 115 out of 160 spots. We had three new WSI's this summer so for one week, they shadowed a veteran WSI to see how classes should run and then they were allowed to lead instruction.
  - Swim team was back, after not being held for 2 summers, with 15 junior swimmers and 23 seniors. Numbers were way down from previous years.
- 3. Overall, I felt the pools went well. I will have full attendance numbers for the September meeting.
- 4. The Summer Fun program went well. The Creek ended up filled almost every week. We were able to bring back field trips. We also had the Rock and Roll Ice Cream truck come by 3 times to provide cold treats to the entire camp. I opted not to bring campers to the pool as the cost for a bus was \$222. We typically don't get a lot of kids to go so we had water day every Wednesday.
- 5. Skyhawks, Painting w/Peggy, various half-day camps and tennis lessons had ok numbers this summer, definitely not as many people as in the past. A full breakdown will be handed out at the September meeting. Unfortunately, we had to cancel several camps/programs because we did not get enough participants.
- 6. Summer continues to be a very busy time of the year and challenging to oversee everything and make sure things are running smoothly. This summer was even more challenging without an Aquatics Director.

- 7. I have already started to receive requests for groups to meet at the Community Center for the upcoming year.
- 8. We will be offering yoga, in person, classes from Personal Euphoria virtually, and dog classes. I am waiting to hear back from other staff about additional classes.

We are planning to have the Trunk or Treat event again, on Saturday, October 22. I hope that this year we can have it as a walk around event and not drive thru, that will depend on any restrictions that may be in place.

We are trying a new twist on the Scarecrow Festival, more information will be given in September.

9. I will begin to submit paperwork to the Board of Education for winter programs.




