The Town of Berlin is seeking statements of qualifications and proposals from qualified engineering and consulting firms to provide evaluation of the three (3) water & sewer utilities in Berlin, namely:

- 1.) Berlin Water Control Commission (BWCC);
- 2.) Kensington Fire District (KFD); and
- 3.) Worthington Fire District.

The purpose of this project is to evaluate the existing services provided by the three water and sewer utilities, analyze current and future customer needs and provide the Town of Berlin with a recommended master plan to meet current and future water and sewer needs. The deliverable will be a report, analyzing the feasibility of continuing with the current system of three separate utilities, considering and evaluating alternatives, consideration of current and future capital needs, analysis of regulatory requirements and compliance, and identifying strategies and future actions necessary to provide the Town with a cohesive, comprehensive plan to meet its current and future water and sewer needs. The capital planning, budgeting, rate making, long-term planning, O&M planning and practices, system management and improvement, customer relationship management, and short-term and long-term administrative resources of each of the three utilities should be evaluated. Likewise, identification of physical resources and options for improving efficiency of operations should be analyzed. The Town seeks a comprehensive report detailing the alternative courses of action to be serve the consumers in the Town of Berlin, as well as recommendations as to best practices/actions necessary to effectuate and efficiently plan to meet Berlin's future water and sewer needs for the long-term (at least the next 20 years). The report should identify options/alternatives and actions the Town should take to implement the comprehensive plan. The report should not limit itself to only the entities presently

serving the Town, rather, the consultant should consider and analyze all feasible options and present a business case evaluation of the recommended alternatives.

One (1) original and two (2) copies of sealed (separate) Statements of Qualifications and Proposals must be received in the Town Manager's Office of the Berlin Town Hall, 240 Kensington Rd, Berlin, CT 06037 by the date and time noted above. The Town will not accept submissions by e-mail or fax. The Town will reject Proposals received after the date and time noted above.

The documents comprising the Request for Proposals may be obtained on the Town's website, www.berlinct.gov, under "Departments, Purchasing, and Current Bids and RFPs" or from Maryssa Tsolis, Purchasing Agent, Berlin Town Hall, Room 20, 240 Kensington Rd, Berlin, CT 06037 during normal business hours. Each proposer is responsible for checking the Town's website to determine if the Town has issued any addenda and, if so, to complete its proposal in accordance with the RFP as modified by the addenda.

The Town reserves the right to amend or terminate this Request for Proposals, accept all or any part of a proposal, reject all Proposals, waive any informalities or non-material deficiencies in a proposal, and award the proposal to the proposer that, in the Town's judgment, will be in the Town's best interests.

1. <u>INTRODUCTION</u>

The Town of Berlin is soliciting qualifications and proposals to engage a Consulting Engineering firm to provide the Town with a comprehensive water and sewer study to assist the Town in long-term planning. Historically, the Town had 3 fire districts, namely Kensington Fire District (KFD), Worthington Fire District (WFD) and East Berlin Fire District (EBFD). Since 1966, the EBFD ceased to exist and the Town of Berlin acquired that water/sewer system and operates it through the Berlin Water Control Commission (BWCC), an enterprise entity operating as a department of the Town. Although there were relationships and mutual projects between the 3 districts, each district has been autonomous.

The Town seeks a comprehensive study to identify options and alternatives so that the Town may determine the best options for long-term water and sewer operations, with a focus on meeting customer needs in a cost-effective manner. This study will be an important tool to assist the Town in making decisions for the future relative to water and sewer needs.

The Town expects to select and contract with one firm to provide consulting/engineering services. This RFP is not a contract offer, and no contract will exist unless and until a written contract is signed by the Town and the successful proposer. Interested parties should submit a proposal in accordance with the requirements and directions contained

in this RFP. The town may choose not to select any firm. The town is an equal opportunity, affirmative action employer, does not discriminate because of race, religion, color, sex, national origin, sexual orientation, marital status, disability or any other factors protected by law.

Background and Intent

It is the goal of the Town to enter into agreement with a vendor that will provide services efficiently, will accurately bill, and will provide high quality, flexible customer service to the Town. The Vendor will be expected to maintain expert knowledge of these services to ensure the Town is receiving the highest quality service at the most affordable rates while maintaining quality and secure technology.

The Town, founded in 1785, covers an area of 27.0 square miles, and is located in the geographic center of the state in Hartford County. Berlin is eleven miles south of the City of Hartford and is bordered by New Britain, Newington, Rocky Hill, Cromwell, Middletown, Meriden and Southington. Berlin's population is approximately 20,000. The Town provides a full range of municipal services including public safety, parks and recreation, public works, health and human services, and water control, with a Grand List of approximately \$2.1 Billion and an operating budget of approximately \$80 Million.

Proposals

Eligible Vendors will be those individuals, businesses and firms that meet the following requirements:

- 1. Proposer must have demonstrated experience and expertise in Connecticut in the past five (5) years regarding the types of or similar services as those outlined in the introduction.
- Proposer must have a proven track record in providing these types of services for similarly sized water and sewer utilities preferably in Connecticut.
- Proposer must be familiar with, qualified, and properly licensed in the State of Connecticut to perform its obligations under this proposal in compliance with all applicable Federal and State of Connecticut laws and regulations, statutes and policies.
- 4. The Town will not award the proposal to any business that, or person who, is in arrears or in default to the Town with regard to any tax, debt, contract, security or any other obligation.
- 5. Documented/audited internal control environment.
- 6. Proposer must have a business continuity plan.

Scope of Services

- 1) Cost of Service Water/Sewer Rate Study
- 2) Capital Improvement Plans/ Water and Sewer 5 year/10 year
- 3) Operating Budget, Staff, Administrative cost structure
- 4) Infiltration/Inflow Reduction Planning and Implementation
- 5) Fire Protection/Fire Flows
- 6) System Expansion Capabilities/Capacity
- 7) Sources of Supplies & Option Safe Yield
- 8) System Evaluation
- 9) Consideration of Long-Term Sustainability of Current Plan and Alternatives
- 10) Analyze water system performance (i.e. analyze and evaluate the three (3) utilities' water distribution, pumping and storage system design and performance, consider age and condition of water and sewage distribution system including residual chlorine concentrations and "C" factors.
- 11) Provide comparisons to benchmark information (i.e. analyze each utilities' rate structure- what actions have been taken to date to improve water and sewer lines, Staffing and fund usage compared to similar utilities).
- 12) Deliverables: a final report with recommendations. The three top alternative engineering solutions that address identified and anticipated deficiencies, should be provided in the final report. Alternative sources and structures should include cost estimates. In other words, a long-term water supply alternative analysis, that takes a holistic approach, is needed.

At its core, we are looking for Professional Engineering services in conjunction with a water distribution system master plan study. The Town's goal is to develop a comprehensive water distribution system master plan that identifies strategies for planning, budgeting, maintaining, and improving the distribution of water within the territorial limits of the Town of Berlin; the plan

should document the existing facilities, identify deficiencies (including gaps in existing master plan resources), identify future water needs over the next 20 years, identify benefits and challenges of existing structure and alternatives (recommending updates/changes to the operational structure of the systems), develop efficient O&M procedures and identify long term capital needs. The plan should address all physical facilities.

Agreement Period

The Town anticipates entering into a contract with the selected Consultant commencing on or about **March 2023.**

The Town will contractually reserve the right to cancel the contract at any time. The agreement period for any contract or purchase order resulting from this RFP shall ultimately be as negotiated to the mutual agreement of the parties.

Additional Conditions

All those submitting Proposals must be willing to adhere to the following additional conditions and must positively state this in the proposal.

- The proposer must certify that the personnel identified in its response
 to this RFP will be the persons actually assigned to the project. At
 its discretion, the Town may require the removal and replacement of
 any of the proposer's personnel who do not perform adequately,
 regardless of whether they were previously approved by the Town.
- 2. All subcontractors hired by the proposer awarded a contract or purchase order as a result of this RFP must have prior approval of the Town prior to and during the agreement period.
- 3. Any contract or purchase order resulting from this RFP process will represent the entire agreement between the proposer and the Town and will supersede all prior negotiations, representations or agreements, alleged or made, between the parties. The Town shall assume no liability for payment of services under the terms of the contract or purchase order until the successful proposer is notified that the contract or purchase order has been accepted and approved

by the Town. Any contract resulting from this RFP may be amended only by means of a written instrument signed by the proposer and signed by the Town Manager.

2. RIGHT TO AMEND OR TERMINATE THE RFP OR CONTRACT

The Town may, in its sole discretion, clarify, modify, amend or terminate this RFP if the Town determines it is in the Town's best interest. The Town has the right to extend the RFP Open Date no later than four (4) business days prior to the scheduled RFP Open Date, via Amendment, if determined it is in the Town's best interest. In the event that an insufficient number of qualified bids are received by the RFP Open Date, the Town may terminate and re-post the RFP if determined it is in the Town's best interest. All such actions shall be affected by a posting on the Town's website, www.town.berlin.ct.us. Each proposer is responsible for checking the Town's website to determine if the Town has issued any addenda and, if so, to complete its proposal in accordance with the RFP as modified by the addenda.

If this RFP provides for a multi-year agreement, the Town also reserves the right to terminate the Contract at the end of the last fiscal year for which funds have been appropriated, and the Town shall have no obligation or liability to the successful proposer for any unfunded year or years.

4. PROPOSAL SUBMISSION INSTRUCTIONS

A. Proposal Requirements & Required Format

Proposals must set forth accurate and complete information for each of the items listed below. At the Town's discretion, failure to do so could result in disqualification. Please ensure your proposal incorporates responses to the below questions, as well as any requested attachments.

2. Experience, Expertise and Capabilities

Any exception or alternative must be clearly delineated and cannot materially affect the substance of this Request for Proposals.
- 6. <u>Cost Proposal</u>. Proposers should utilize the Proposal Form included in this RFP as Attachment A, to provide a **total** annual cost. **Additionally**, proposers must attach a breakdown of the cost proposal per month (including hourly rates) utilizing the information contained within Attachment A.

Your Statement of Qualifications should be submitted in a sealed envelope marked "Berlin Townwide Water & Sewer Service Utilities: SOQ." Your proposal should be submitted in a sealed envelope marked "Berlin Townwide Water & Sewer Service Utilities:Proposal." All submissions shall be made to the Town Manager's Office at the Berlin Town Hall, 240 Kensington Rd, Berlin, CT 06037, by no later than 10:00 a.m. February 20, 2023. The Town will not accept submissions by e-mail or fax. Proposers are solely responsible for ensuring timely delivery. The Town will NOT accept late submissions.

Proposal prices must be submitted on the Proposal Form included in this RFP. All blank spaces for proposal prices must be completed in ink or be typewritten.

Proposals may be withdrawn personally or in writing provided that the Town receives the withdrawal prior to the time and date the Proposals are scheduled to be opened. Proposals are considered valid, and may not be withdrawn, cancelled or modified, for sixty (60) days after the opening date, to give the Town sufficient time to review the Proposals, investigate the proposers' proposals, secure any required municipal approvals, and execute a binding contract with the successful proposer.

An authorized person representing the legal entity of the proposer must sign the Proposal Form and all other forms included in this RFP.

5. QUESTIONS AND AMENDMENTS

Proposers are prohibited from contacting any other Town employee, officer or official concerning this RFP. A proposer's failure to comply with this requirement may result in disqualification.

The appropriate Town representative listed above must receive any questions from proposers no later than seven (7) days before the proposal opening date. That representative will confirm receipt of a proposer's questions by e-mail. The Town will answer all written questions by issuing one or more addenda, which shall be a part of this RFP and the resulting Contract, containing all questions received as provided for above and decisions regarding same.

At least four (4) calendar days prior to proposal opening, the Town will post any addenda on the Town's website, www.town.berlin.ct.us. Each proposer is responsible for checking the website to determine if the Town has issued any addenda and, if so, to complete its proposal in accordance with the RFP as modified by the addenda.

No oral statement of the Town, including oral statements by the Town representatives listed above, shall be effective to waive, change or otherwise modify any of the provisions of this RFP, and no proposer shall rely on any alleged oral statement.

6. <u>ADDITIONAL INFORMATION</u>

The Town reserves the right, either before or after the opening of Proposals, to ask any proposer to clarify its proposal or to submit additional information that the Town in its sole discretion deems desirable.

7. COSTS FOR PREPARING PROPOSAL

Each proposer's costs incurred in developing its proposal are its sole responsibility, and the Town shall have no liability for such costs.

8. OWNERSHIP OF PROPOSALS

All Proposals submitted become the Town's property and will not be returned to proposers.

9. FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT

All information submitted in a proposal or in response to a request for additional information is subject to disclosure under the Connecticut Freedom of Information. Proposers are encouraged **not** to include in their Proposals any information which is proprietary a trade secret or otherwise confidential. All materials associated with this procurement process are subject to the terms of state laws defining freedom of information and privacy, and all rules, regulations and interpretations resulting from those laws.

10. REFERENCES

Each proposer must complete and submit the Proposer's Statement of References form included in this RFP.

11. **LEGAL STATUS**

If a proposer is a corporation, Limited Liability Company, or other business entity this is required to register with the Connecticut Secretary of State's Office, it must have a

current registration on file with that office. The Town may, in its sole discretion, request acceptable evidence of any proposer's legal status. Each proposer must complete and submit the Proposer's Legal Status Disclosure form included in this RFP.

12. PRESUMPTION OF PROPOSER'S FULL KNOWLEDGE

Each proposer is responsible for having read and understood each document in this RFP and any addenda issued by the Town. A proposer's failure to have reviewed all information that is part of or applicable to this RFP, including but not only any addenda posted on the Town's website, shall in no way relieve it from any aspect of its proposal or the obligations related thereto.

Each proposer is deemed to be familiar with and is required to comply with all federal, state and local laws, regulations, ordinances, codes and orders that in any manner relate to this RFP or the performance of the work described herein.

By submitting a proposal, each proposer represents that it has thoroughly examined and become familiar with the scope of work outlined in this RFP, and it is capable of performing the work to achieve the Town's objectives. If applicable, each proposer shall visit the site, examine the areas and thoroughly familiarize itself with all conditions of the property before preparing its proposal.

13. TAX EXEMPTIONS

The Town is exempt from the payment of federal excise taxes and Connecticut sales tax and use taxes. Such taxes must not be included in prices.

14. AWARD CRITERIA & SELECTION

All Proposals will be publicly opened and read aloud as received on the date, at the time, and at the place identified in this RFP. Proposers may be present at the opening.

The Town reserves the right to correct, after proposer verification, any mistake in a proposal that is a clerical error, such as a price extension, decimal point error or terms. If any error exists in an extension of prices, the unit price shall prevail.

The Town reserves the right to accept all or any part of a proposal, reject all Proposals, and waive any informalities or non-material deficiencies in a proposal. The Town also reserves the right, if applicable, to award the purchase of individual items under this RFP to any combination of separate Proposals or proposers.

The Town will accept the proposal that, in the sole discretion of the Town, is determined to be in the Town's best interests. Although price will be an important factor, it will not be the only basis for award. Due consideration may also be given to a proposer's

experience, references, service, ability to respond promptly to requests, past performance, and other criteria relevant to the Town's interests, including compliance with the procedural requirements stated in this RFP.

A. Evaluation Criteria

The following specific criteria are expected to be among those utilized in the selection process. They are presented as a guide for the proposer in understanding the Town's requirements and expectation for this project and are not necessarily all inclusive or presented in order of importance.

- The background experience, and strength of the Proposer in providing similar services elsewhere, including the level of experience in working with other Connecticut municipalities of similar size, and the quality of services performed, either for other school systems or other municipalities, or both.
- The Proposer's responsiveness and compliance with the RFP requirements and conditions to provide the services requested.
- A review of references provided with the Proposal, and administration of prior contracts.
- Competitiveness of proposed fee. The Town reserves the right to negotiate fees with the selected Proposer.

The Town may elect to have the Proposals evaluated by a committee as part of making a selection. If deemed necessary, the Town reserves the right to arrange for interviews/oral presentations as part of the selection process, which invitations for interviews may involve a short-listing of the Proposals received.

If the proposer does not execute the Contract within ten (10) business days of the date of notification, unless extended by the Town, the Town may call any proposal security provided by the proposer and may enter into discussions with another proposer. The Town will post the Preliminary Notice of Award and related information on its website, www.town.berlin.ct.us, under "Bid and RFP Information."

The Interview and Contract Execution dates in Key Dates are anticipated, not certain, dates.

INDEMNIFICATION

The Vendor at its own expense and without exception, shall indemnify, defend and pay all damages, costs, expenses, including attorney fees, and otherwise hold harmless the Town of Berlin, its employees, and agents, from any liability of any nature or kind in regard to the delivery of these services. The Vendor shall secure and maintain General Liability Insurance as will protect him from claims under the Worker's Compensation Acts and from claims for bodily injury, death, or property damage which may arise from the performance of his services under this contract.
